PROMOTING ENERGY EFFICIENCY IN EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS OF TURKESTAN REGION

11 February 2025

Turkestan, Kazakhstan

Background

The Ministry of Industry and Construction of the Republic of Kazakhstan, in collaboration with the European Union funded project "Sustainable Energy Connectivity in Central Asia" (SECCA), is systematically working to promote and implement energy-efficient technologies in the country's educational institutions. As part of this initiative, the parties organised a series of <u>regional training sessions</u> for representatives of government bodies and educational institutions in the cities of Shymkent, Turkestan, and Aktau in July 2024.

Launched in 2022, the SECCA project aims to strengthen policies in the countries of Central Asia for transitioning to a sustainable energy system, improve investment climate, and build capacities for the renewable energy and energy efficiency deployment. Special attention is paid to raising awareness about sustainable energy, its accessibility and benefits. Clause 23 of the National Action Plan for the implementation of the President's State of the Nation Address dated 1st September 2023 stipulates that the current energy efficiency policy must be revised in line with the OECD standards. The key priorities include fostering a culture of energy conservation and saving, introducing regulatory requirements, and reducing the energy intensity of buildings by 15% by 2029.

The widespread use of energy efficiency labelling for buildings is considered one of the most effective solutions. In Kazakhstan, the legislative framework has already been established, including approved regulations for determining energy efficiency rating and a building labelling system that meets the European standards. Building energy efficiency labelling serves as a tool to increase transparency in energy consumption and encourage the implementation of energy-efficient technologies, particularly in the public sector, which currently accounts for 8% of total energy consumption.

The Ministry of Industry and Construction of the Republic of Kazakhstan supports the building energy efficiency labelling and is actively expanding this approach to new educational facilities. As part of the visit to the Turkestan region, the representatives of the Committee of Industry of the Ministry of Industry and Construction and the experts of the SECCA project present the Energy Efficiency Labels to the public schools built in 2023–2024, as well as deliver lectures for the representatives of these schools.

The goal of these activities is to raise awareness about Kazakhstan's energy efficiency policy and showcase successful sustainable energy solutions in public buildings. This event represents an important step towards achieving national goals in reducing energy consumption and improving energy efficiency.

¹ Kazakhstan is implementing the national project "Comfortable School," which aims to build 369 new-format schools, providing 740,000 student places by the end of 2026. To date, 104 schools have already been built, another 104 will be completed by the end of 2025, and the remaining ones by the end of 2026.
