What is the DFG?

Germany's largest research funding organisation

- ► Central **self-governing research organisation** in Germany
- ► Predecessor founded 1920
- Annual budget of € 3.9 billion (German federal government (69.3%), German states (29.4%), private sources (1.3%))
- ► Politically rather independent
- ► About 1,000 employees at the Head Office in Bonn
- ▶ 6 DFG Representations Abroad





What is the DFG?

Germany's largest research funding organisation

The DFG is an association under private law.

The DFG can only act through its governing bodies Executive Board and General Assembly.



Research Performing Institutions

- Fraunhofer-Gesellschaft (FhG): application-oriented research
 - (76 institutes, 31.000 staff, 3,4 bn EUR 2023)
- ► Helmholtz Association (HGF): fundamental sciences with high impact
 - (18 centres, 44.700 staff, 5,96 bn EUR 2022)
- ► Leibniz Association (WGL): long-term research / service
 - (97 institutes, 21.000 staff, 2,17 bn EUR 2022)
- ► Max Planck Society (MPG): basic research
 - (84 institutes, 24.600 staff, 2,1 bn EUR 2023)









Research Funding Institutions

- **▶** Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft (DFG)
 - Funding organisation for researchers /universities
 - 3.9 bln € (2023), 1,000 staff
- ► German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD)
 - International exchange of students and researchers
 - 839.3 Mio € (2023), 1,000 staff
- ► Alexander von Humboldt Foundation (AvH):
 - Promotion of academic cooperation between scientists and scholars from abroad and from Germany
 - 183 Mio € (2023), 288 staff





What does the DFG do? Germany's largest research funding organisation

The DFG

- serves all branches of science and the humanities by funding research projects and facilitating cooperation among researchers
- ► takes particular care to promote international cooperation, early career researchers, gender equality and diversity in science and the humanities
- advises parliaments and public authorities on scientific matters
- fosters relations between research and the private sector and between scientists and academics at home and abroad





What and whom does the DFG fund? Germany's largest research funding organisation


- Research projects of all sizes (> 30,000 per year) in all branches of science and the humanities
- ► Funding as a bottom-up process and in competition
- ► Science-driven research, often basic research
- Quality-driven rather than impact-driven
- ► No thematic nor regional nor political priorities
- ► (Projects by) researchers at higher education and research institutions in Germany (with at least a doctorate)
- ► All funding lines are open and suitable for international cooperation
- > Partners from abroad are usually expected to bring their own funding






DFG in a Nutshell

How does the DFG promote international cooperation? Activities and Instruments

- ► All funding lines are open and suitable for international cooperation
 - Grants for travel
 - Guest researchers
 - Joint workshops
- ► Joint calls with partner organizations
- ► Conferences, talks, workshops
- ▶ DFG Representations Abroad

How does the DFG promote international cooperation? Funding Opportunities

► Funding principles for funding bilateral research projects:

- DFG funds the part of the project based in Germany
 - Scientists can apply for international funding like travel costs, exchange of researchers in all DFG funding programmes
- No special funds for funding international projects
 - Proposals for international collaborations must compete with all other proposals in the same DFG programme

Complementary funding

- by another funding organisation, the relevant university or non-university research institution, or another source
- Exception: bilateral projects with development aided countries from DAC-list
 - DFG funds both parts of the project in Germany and in the partner country

How does the DFG promote international cooperation? Funding Opportunities

Initiation of International Collaboration

► Funding

- Funding max. 1 year
- Application by the German partner
- Mobility funding to get to know each other
- One aim could be: prepare a joint project proposal
- DFG-Guidelines 1.813

▶ Modules

- Workshops in Germany or abroad
- Short individual visits in Germany or abroad
- Visit up to three months









How does the DFG promote international cooperation? Funding Opportunities

Research Grant

- Research project on a specifically defined topic within a limited time period
- A research grant can be used to
 - Staff
 - Equipment up to €10,000, software and consumables
 - Travel
 - Visiting researchers
 - **Mercator Fellows** (associated with the project over the long term)
 - Experimental animals
 - Publication expenses
 - Funding for instrumentation (€50,000 or more)
- 3 years (6 years)
- No submission deadline
- **Information on formalities**: DFG-Form 50.01

How does the DFG promote international cooperation? Funding Opportunities

Cooperation with Official Development Assistance (ODA) Recipients

▶ Funding

- Funding max. 3 years
- Application by the German partner
- DFG funds German part <u>and</u> part in the respective country
- Project partner is from a country that is eligible to receive ODA and is included on the OECD DAC-List (partner has to provide a statement that they are unable to provide local funding)
- DFG transfers fund to German Partner, who transfers part of fund to Cooperation Partner

▶ Modules

- Funding for staff employed by collaborating partners on basis of customary local rates
- Scientific instrumentation, equipment to be used by collaboration partner; they become property of collaborating partner's country
- Consumables and commodities



Proposals and Approvals 2020 – 2024 with country reference*






Funding Statistics Central Asia 2020-2024 Proposals and Approvals

2020–2024 (5 years): 162 <u>proposals</u> with reference to 5 CA-countries




2020–2024 (5 years): 48 approvals with reference to 5 CA-countries






Funding Statistics Kazakhstan Proposals and Approvals 2020 – 2024

2020 – 2024 (5 years): 11 <u>approvals</u> with reference to Kazakhstan










Support the internationalisation of German Universities of Applied Sciences (UAS)




